

ORDINANCE NO. 1972-4

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CHARLESTOWN,
INDIANA PROHIBITING THE ACT OF PEDDLING
FROM MOTOR VEHICLES

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the members of the Common Council of the City of Charlestown, Indiana, the act of peddling from motor vehicles within the corporate limits of said city constitutes a danger to elements of the citizenry of said city and particularly to the children of said city;

NOW THEREFORE:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHARLESTOWN, INDIANA:


SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to sell or offer for sale candy, ice cream, confection, or other food or beverage for human consumption from any motor vehicle or any vehicle or cart of whatever nature, on any public street, alley, or sidewalk in the City of Charlestown, Indiana;

SECTION 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each violation or offense.


SECTION 3. This Ordinance repeals all previous Ordinance relating to the subject herein and supersedes all the provisions thereof.
